Numbered Notes:

- **Note 1: Transfer Course Options.** Lower-level general education courses can be taken at WTCC, ODU, and/or standardized examination (i.e. CLEP, DSST). To ensure optimal transfer of credits, students are strongly encouraged to consult with an ODU enrollment coordinator before registering for general education courses at WTCC. ENG 112 Writing, Research in the Disciplines and ENG 114 Professional Research & Report at WTCC will all meet the second English requirement for ODU. In the WTCC Subject Area Course Categories, SWK 113 Cultural Competency & Diversity has been determined equivalent to HMSV 346 Diversity Issues in Human Services at ODU. Students will save both time and money by completing this course at WTCC.
- **Note 2: Nature of Science Requirement.** ODU requires 4 credit hours of an approved science course with a lab. This course may be completed at ODU or WTCC.
- **Note 3: Humanities Requirement.** ODU requires 6 credit hours in ODU lower-division general education Humanities. WTCC students are encouraged to select REL 110 World Religions at WTCC which will transfer to ODU as PHIL 250E World Religions: Beliefs and Values. Students who do not transfer in equivalent coursework will need to fulfill the requirement at ODU.
- **Note 4: Upper Division General Education.** Complete a minimum of 6 credits in approved courses at the upper division (300/400 level) or a Minor.
- **Note 5: Addiction Prevention and Treatment Certificate/CSAC or CADC Credentialing Opportunity.** Students who pursue this certificate will gain the knowledge, skills, and abilities to recognize the signs and symptoms of substance abuse, understand crisis intervention and relapse prevention strategies, develop substance abuse prevention and recovery programs, treat individuals and families affected by addiction, and make ethical decisions as a human services professional. The certificate program consists of six courses within the ODU Human Services program for a total of 18 credit hours. If you plan to seek CSAC or CADC credentialing **outside of Virginia**, please contact your state board to determine how this certificate can meet your state's requirements.
- **Note 6: Internship Requirements.** HMSV 468 is a required 400-hour internship completed after all degree coursework. This internship offers students valuable hands-on experience in the field and opportunities for networking and future job prospects. The experience is structured to allow students to apply knowledge gained from prior coursework in a real-world setting. Students who complete WTCC's WBL courses with a C or better may request approval to apply up to 100 indirect hours toward ODU's 400-hour internship requirement. Students who have already completed 5 years of full-time experience in the field of human services can submit a portfolio to be considered for HMSV 468 credit.

- A grade of C or higher is required to receive transfer course credit.
